#### **Our Speaker and Panelists**

Angela Howard has been indexing since 1999. Prior to that, she was a technical writer for 12 years for database and web client/server software. She specializes in indexing technical manuals and trade books on software applications, programming, and methodologies, but she has also indexed books on education, grant writing, arts and crafts, nutrition, and alternative medicine. She has done embedded indexing in Word, Framemaker, InDesign, and XML, and uses Sky for standalone indexes. Angela served as Treasurer of the Southern California chapter before transferring to the Pacific Northwest Chapter.

**Scott Smiley** is a full-time freelance indexer who is the past-chair of PNW/ASI. A member of ASI since 1999 and of PNW/ASI since 2002, he previously served two terms as chapter treasurer. Scott was an instructor for the Graduate School (USDA) indexing course from 2009 until its demise in 2015 and has a Ph.D. in geography. He indexes primarily scholarly works in the social sciences, humanities, and other fields.

Maria Sosnowski started indexing part-time in 2005, and balances that with part-time employment in a law library. Her indexing centers around law, social sciences, and education, plus a variety of other topics, and she avoids hard science, medicine, and anything that sounds like philosophy and literary criticism. Her clients include authors, packagers, publishers, and other indexers, and she likes to be creative about pricing structures for her work.

Madge Walls has been indexing for 12 years, after many years in real estate. Through no fault of her own, she has specialized in scholarly books with an occasional math text thrown in. She enjoys travelling and writing fiction. Her two published novels reflect her life growing up and raising her children in Hawaii.

**Carolyn Weaver**, a founding member of the Pacific Northwest Chapter, has served multiple times as President and Treasurer of ASI, and as an exam reviewer for the ASI Training in Indexing course. She is the recipient of the 2015 Hines Award. She was a medical librarian for 35 years, including 11 years as a moonlighting indexer, before transitioning to full-time indexing in 2000. Her indexing specialties include health, behavioral, and social sciences.

#### Southbound on I-5 (from Seattle)

- 1. Take I-5 to exit 7, I-205 south.

- 3. Follow steps 4-6 below.

#### Northbound on I-5/I-205 (from Eugene)

- 1. Take I-5 north to I-205.
- 2. Follow I-205 across the Columbia River into Washington.
- 3. Take the exit for Highway 14 east.
- 4. Take exit 8 for 164th.
- 5. Left onto 164th, and drive until you reach Tech Center Drive (light after 15th)
- 6. Right onto Tech Center Drive. Hotel is on your right.

- 1. Take I-5 or I-205 north across the Columbia River into Washington.
- 2. Take the exit for Highway 14 east.

## Sherry Smith Award for a new indexer

The Sherry Smith Award of the Pacific Northwest Chapter of the American Society for Indexing will grant \$100 to help one new indexer per year attend a PNW fall conference. In order to apply, you must:

- 1. Be currently enrolled in an indexing course for initial training in indexing. This includes the ASI Training in Indexing course, the UC Berkeley Extension Indexing: Theory and Application course, or individual instruction from an established professional indexer.
- OR

2. Be in your first year after completion of one of the courses above, as of the date of the fall conference.

#### AND

Apply no later than one month before the fall conference (August 14, 2019). Application is by email to the membership coordinator, Maria Sosnowski, at <u>maria@index-plus.com</u>. In the email, include your name, location, course/teacher, completion date if applicable, and contact information for verification. Winner must be willing to volunteer for the Program Team for a one year period after selection, which is a group of indexers who help plan the fall conference. The purpose of the award is to help emerging indexers experience the benefits of networking with other indexers while we harness your ideas and energy to invigorate future conferences.

The winner will be selected by random drawing from the pool of applicants who meet the criteria. The winner will be awarded \$100 which will be allocated first towards the conference fee, and then any balance remaining will be paid to the winner at the conference to defray other conference-related travel costs. Conference attendance is required. Prior winners are not eligible.
