	Enid's program explores how to follow and index a personal story —either biography or narrative—with all the variants that can make the process difficult to comprehend, such as events in a life, multiple personalities, roles/titles, and interactions among numerous people. Enid will lead us through the sometimes complicated process of creating a usable index from a mass of information. These can be some of the more challenging types of projects even for experienced indexers. They require an approach different from textbooks and works already formatted into divisions. The day-long workshop covers how to create a working structure, phrase entries, and deal with metatopic issues. Hands-on exercises are included, so bring your laptop if you want to use your indexing software. Also one exercise is from the book <i>Into Thin Air</i> , so if you have a copy or want to read it in advance, you will find the story immensely interesting, but note that the book does NOT contain an index. Our Speakers:

Carol Roberts has been indexing full-time for 23 years. Most of her work has been on academic books in a variety of subjects in the humanities, and she's now expanding the trade-book side of her business. Over the years, she has presented a variety of workshops for ASI chapters (and national) and has also taught beginning and intermediate indexing courses.

Enid L. Zafran started indexing in 1975 in Cleveland, Ohio, where she learned the skill as part of her job at a law publishing company there. She later managed the indexing department at the Cleveland company and then from 1990-2002 was Director of Indexing Services at the Bureau of National Affairs (BNA) in Washington, D.C. She started her own indexing business, Indexing Partners, in 1989, and has specialized in legal indexing as well as scholarly, art, psychology, public policy, and education indexing. She trains other indexers in her Indexing Boot Camp, and has written extensively about indexing style and business topics. Winner of the Hines Award in 2010 for her contribution to the field of indexing, Enid has had an association with ASI for over 30 years serving the organization in many capacities.
